The Code Applicant and URCA acknowledge that the information contained on this request form is sensitive and will be treated as confidential. However URCA shall decide which information should be protected from disclosure, taking into account any submissions in support of confidentiality made by the Code Applicant. Information requested for BIRRDS will become available to the public upon input into the database.

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The Code Applicant is not required to submit a completed Part 2 Form (Routing and Rating Information) to URCA. However, after a CO Code is assigned, it is the responsibility of the Code Applicant to enter, by itself or via an agent, the required Part 2 information into the Telcordia Traffic Routing Administration (TRA) BIRRDS databases in order to notify the telecommunications industry to activate the CO Code in the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN).
